

NEWS FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL

Annual Village Meeting



This took place on 11 May, and the attendance was even down on last year, with only two members of the parish making an appearance. We can only hope this means that on the whole things are seen as satisfactory!

Council Chair, Brenda Holmes, summarised the activities for 2015/16. These focused mainly on maintenance and on consultative matters – e.g. cold calling, and transport – and there have been few visible changes to the parish landscape. We still await the ‘no-cold-calling’ signs promised by ERYC; perhaps the new financial year will see progress on that front. Meanwhile, stickers for house windows are available in the new leaflet box in Fangfoss bus shelter. On transport, the parish council reported to ERYC following local discussions on needs in our parish and their consultation process is still ongoing. **FOR FULL VERSIONS OF ALL REPORTS SEE THE WEBSITE (OVER)**

 Expenditure for 2015/16 was £6,972, with a grant for the new litter bin in Spittal recouping £365 of that. Any further shortfall on the precepted sum of £6,500 is easily covered by VAT receipts. The precept has stayed at the lower rate adopted in 2012 for 5 years (to include 2016/17).

Parking – warning of preventative action



Sadly, requests for consideration when parking near school have had little effect. Most notably, cars parking up to the junction prevent motorists turning in to Station Road when there is oncoming traffic – a very dangerous situation given the traffic flow on the main road. The police can act on photographic evidence of cars infringing Highway Code regulations e.g. parking within 10m of a junction. After due warning via school, volunteers will therefore be checking the junctions in coming weeks and will photograph any car parked in contravention of the Highway Code posing an obstruction.



Frogs The parish council was approached by a resident concerned about the number of frogs meeting their end on the road in Highfield Lane. We are still researching ways of tackling the problem. Meanwhile, please bear in mind frogs crossing as you approach the area.
